

A BYLAW OF THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF MINBURN NO. 27, VEGREVILLE, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA TO AMEND LAND USE BYLAW NO. 1348-24.

WHEREAS Section 191 of the *Municipal Government Act*, Revised Statutes of Alberta (RSA), 2000, Chapter M-26 allows Council to pass a bylaw to amend a bylaw of the municipality.

AND WHEREAS Council at its meeting of December 19, 2016 adopted the County of Minburn No. 27 Land Use Bylaw No. 1254-16.

AND WHEREAS NW 8-52-14-W4M, located in the County of Minburn, Alberta is identified on the Land Use District Map 5 as Direct Control (DC) District.

AND WHEREAS an application has been made to amend the County of Minburn No. 27 Land Use Bylaw to redistrict NW 8-52-14-W4M from Direct Control (DC) District to General Commercial (GC) District;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the County of Minburn No. 27 in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled hereby enacts as follows:

- **1.** County of Minburn No. 27 Land Use Bylaw No. 1348-24 as amended is hereby amended by:
 - 1.1 Redistricting NW 8-52-14-W4M from Direct Control (DC) District to General Commercial (GC) District, as shown on the sketch plan annexed hereto as Schedule "A".


2. SEVERABILITY

B. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL:

The subject property is located on NW 8-52-14-W4M immediately east of the Prairie Ag Center (Lot 1, Block 1, Plan 1522598), fronting Hwy 16. The applicant is proposing to create six (6) undeveloped lots for future commercial use. The subject land was recently rezoned from Direct Control to General Commercial and developed as Phase 2 in accordance with the NW 8-52-14-W4M Conceptual Scheme dated January 27, 2015.

A stormwater management plan was submitted with this application, which includes on-site stormwater ponds on proposed Lots 2, 3, 5, 6, and 7. These ponds are designed to ensure that post-development stormwater flows match pre-development levels. Proposed Lot 4, which is primarily a wetland, will receive drainage from these ponds via a swale that runs between the six lots. The applicant/developer would be solely responsible for costs associated with construction of the stormwater management ponds/drainage.

Proposed Lot 2 will be the first to be developed and will be accessed via the existing Highway 16 Service Road. A 30 m wide service road plan will be registered, and the applicant/developer will be responsible for future road construction costs as the remaining lots are developed.

C. NOTIFICATION:

Adjacent property owners and agencies were notified of both the proposed subdivision and redistricting application on July 30, 2025 – no objections.

Alberta Transportation and Economic Corridors provided their standard response, additionally requiring that a 30 m service road shall be dedicated and constructed along the highway frontage of Hwy 16.

TELUS advised to have the developer contact their office to initiate a right of way agreement with TELUS in order to protect any future facilities that will be placed to service this development.

D. COMPLIANCE:

The proposed subdivision complies with municipal statutory plans and the Subdivision and Development Regulation.

E. RESERVES:

A deferred reserve caveat has previously been dedicated on this parcel.

F. RECOMMENDATION

That the proposed subdivision application be **approved**, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That prior to endorsement, a registerable instrument be prepared by an Alberta Land Surveyor and submitted to the County, and the registerable instrument shall be in conformance with the approved tentative plan of subdivision.
- 2. That the registered owner(s) enter into a development agreement by way of Caveat with the County of Minburn pursuant to Sections 661 and 662 of the Municipal Government Act, 2000 as amended, pertaining to the provision of future infrastructure upgrades (roads, stormwater management ponds, drainage ditches, utilities, and approaches) necessary to serve the development.
- 3. That prior to endorsement of the registerable instrument, written documentation prepared by a certified private sewage installer shall be submitted to the County which indicates that on-site private sewage treatment systems can be considered for approval in accordance with the Alberta Private Sewage Disposal System Regulation (AR 229/97) given the soil conditions, size and configuration of proposed Lot 2, Block 1, Lot 3, Block 1, Lot 4, Block 1, Lot 5, Block 1, Lot 6, Block 1, and Lot 7, Block 1.
- 4. That all outstanding property taxes are to be paid pursuant to Section 654 of the Municipal Government Act, 2000 as amended.

Information Items (these are not conditions of approval):


1. That registration of the proposed subdivision at the Land Titles office may result in a change in the assessment of the proposed lots. Please contact Municipal Assessment Services at 780-939-3310 with regards to any questions about assessment.

- 2. That the registered owner(s) contact TELUS to initiate a right of way agreement to protect any future utilities that will be placed to service this development. Please contact TELUS at circulations@telus.com.
- 3. That the necessary Safety Code Permits, which include building, plumbing, electrical, gas and private sewage permits would be required prior to any and all new construction, alteration, or change in use or occupancy of a building on-site. Please contact the Inspections Group for further information on Safety Code Permit requirements.
- 4. The proposed subdivision may be affected by a permanent, naturally occurring body of water or watercourse. The Province has an interest in the Crown ownership of Provincial waterbodies/or Public Land boundaries in Alberta. Development or water diversion may not occur in waterbodies including wetlands, watercourses, or Public Lands without prior consultation and approval from Alberta Environment and Protected Areas. If you have any questions about development on or near water bodies, watercourses, or public land please contact Alberta Environment and Protected Areas prior to undertaking any activity (including construction of a private driveway) within or near the lake/wetland.
- 5. That approval of this application does not excuse the applicant from ascertaining and complying with the requirements of other municipal bylaws, easements, environmental reserve easements, covenants, conservation agreements, development agreements, or Provincial or Federal statutes, regulations, licenses or codes or standards of practice.






1.0 OVERVIEW

1.1 Background

The proposed dig at GWD 47830 on the NPS 12 Flat Lake Lateral aligns with TC Energy's Integrity Management Plan. The excavation is a result of Pipeline Maintenance Plan activities from the Stress Corrosion Cracking Threat Management Program, and the targeted repair will mitigate the threat posed by the identified features:

1.2 TWP Road 51-4

Construction activities planned at this location may include, but not be limited to, the following:

5.0 TASK SPECIFIC WORK PLAN

5.1 Traffic Management

See attached traffic Accommodation Strategy prepared by Secure.

5.2 Backfill, Compaction, and Compaction Testing

The backfill scope will be completed to requirements specified by the County of Minburn in order to maintain the integrity of the road surface for traffic. These requirements are attached in Attachment A.

Any requirements not specified in Attachment A will be completed as per the TC Energy Typical Access Road standard, attached in Attachment B. If there are conflicting requirements, the County of Minburn requirements in Attachment A will take precedence.

To complete the backfill as per Attachment A, TES-CT-COMPC-GL (Attachment C) and TES-CI-EARTH-GLE Section 7 (Attachment D) will be referenced. Additionally:

- The excavated material will be reused for backfilling wherever possible. Subgrade and top course materials and thicknesses must match the existing material.
- Reports will be kept as records confirming that backfilling was performed in layers not exceeding 150 mm in thickness, and that a minimum of 95% SPMDD was achieved.
- The slope of the finished surface should be maintained at 3%, sloping away from the centerline of the road.

County requires a minimum 98%

Construction activities will be expedited to avoid backfill activities during frost conditions. If early frost is encountered, heating and hoarding will be utilized to ensure the material and conditions will allow proper compaction to be achieved.

6.0 ENVIRONMENT & POST CONSTRUCTION REMEDIATION

Site environmental assessments are completed before, during and after construction to ensure compliance to requirements and commitments.

The Pipeline Integrity Program level Environmental Protection Plan (EPP) will be followed (attached in Attachment E), which details on-site mitigation measures for the various environmental conditions that may be encountered throughout the lifecycle of the project.

During the course of construction, an Environmental Inspector will be made available on-site in order to provide independent oversight of compliance to both TC Energy's TOPs/BMP's and all applicable Provincial and Federal environmental regulations, including seeding requirements, and analytical sampling & disposal of waste.

Following the completion of construction an Environmental Inspector will complete a clean-up assessment of the project site and identify if future remediation work is required.

Fleet purchases/Maintenance:

 The Ford F150 half-ton approved in 2025 has been delivered and put into service. Units 220 and 228 are being advertised for sale by tender. Results of the sale will be brought to Council at a later date.

Unit 520, a 2008 D7 Cat, experienced a torque converter failure. Due to this
and related contamination, the machine has been with Finning in Edmonton
for repair since August 20, 2025. The cost of repair, including contamination,
is approximately \$79,846.00 and has been approved by the CAO in accordance
with Policy AD 1008-01.

Public Works Update:

- The construction project on RR 85, south of Twp Rd 512 has been completed.
- Construction is ongoing on Twp Rd 490 and RR 85 in Division 1.
- The gravel program was completed by August 13.
- The stockpile management project had been completed by moving gravel to Innisfree and Zaparose.
- Oiling crews have completed all planned projects. Crews are now focusing on screening the ½" gravel pile next to Emcon to ensure better quality material for future use.

Contracted Services:

- TerraPro has completed the bridge culvert replacement on RR 123, south of Twp 512 in Division 5 (BF 01819).

- 2. Priority will be given to requests from municipalities at a distance from Edmonton and to municipalities that Minister Williams has not yet had an opportunity to meet with.

Meeting requests received after the deadline will not be considered for the convention.

Meeting times with the Minister are scheduled for approximately 15 minutes. This allows the Minister to engage with as many councils as possible. All municipalities that submit meeting requests will be notified at least two weeks prior to the convention as to the status of their request.

Municipal Affairs will make every effort to find alternative meeting opportunities throughout the remainder of the year for municipalities the Minister is unable to accommodate during the convention.

RE: Riverside Cemetery Riverbank Assessment Project

Dear Pat.

The Town of Vegreville has been the caretaker of Riverside Cemetery since 1905. Our cemetery is the final resting place of many Town and County residents, including Private Russel Thomas Moore who was a World War I casualty in 1918 and RCMP Constable Wilfred J. Cobble who was killed in the line of duty in 1946. Some of our oldest graves, bearing dates in the very early 1900's, are located on the banks of the Vermilion River as, I imagine, the surviving relatives determined this would be a peaceful and idyllic resting place for their loved ones.

In 2020, a large portion of the riverbank gave way. In 2022, the Town of Vegreville applied for a grant through the Government of Alberta's Watershed Resiliency and Restoration Program (WRRP) and received funding to utilize bioengineering to stabilize the banks on the south side of the cemetery. This year, the fence on the east side of the cemetery is starting to move and collapse. The Town has contacted Associated Environmental Consultants Inc. to provide a quote to assess the entire riverbank surrounding Riverside Cemetery and a quote to design bioengineering solutions for the failing portion of the east bank.

The Town will utilize the information provided to apply for another grant through WRRP for the bank assessment to be completed in 2026 and intends to apply in the 2026-2027 funding years for another bioengineering installation project in 2027. As the Cemetery is located in the County of Minburn and is the resting place of some County residents, the Town of Vegreville is requesting a letter of support from the County of Minburn No. 27 for the Riverside Cemetery Bank Stabilization Project to include in our application. Should the application be successful there will also be opportunities for the County to participate in educational sessions and tours of the project.
